ORDINANCE #988

AN ORDINANCE MAKING IT UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON TO OPERATE OR DRIVE A MOTOR VEHICLE UPON ABBY DUSON ROAD IN ACADIA PARISH, LOUISIANA, WITH A GROSS WEIGHT IN EXCESS OF **TWELVE (12) TONS**, AND PROVIDING FOR THE PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED by the Police Jury of Acadia Parish, Louisiana, that it shall be unlawful for any person except local farmers during harvest and garbage truck

drivers to operate a motor vehicle with a gross weight in excess of Twelve (12) Tons on the following described parish road:

Abby Duson Road

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that any person found guilty of operating or driving a motor vehicle with a gross weight exceeding **Twelve (12) Tons** on the parish roads described above, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction therefore, shall be fined nor more than Fifty Dollars (\$50) or be imprisoned not more than ten (10) days or both.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Title 2 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 provides that cities, towns, parishes, and other political subdivisions of this State may separately or jointly acquire, establish, construct, expand, own, lease, control, equip, improve, maintain, operate, regulate, and police airports and landing fields for use of aircraft; and,

WHEREAS, the State of Louisiana, Department of Transportation and Development, Division of Aviation (formerly the LA DOTD-OAPT) is charged by Title 2 with the responsibility for the development of aviation facilities within the State to foster air

commerce and to safeguard the interests of those engaged in all phases of the aviation industry and of the general public; and,

WHEREAS, the Acadia Parish Police Jury, hereinafter referred to as "Sponsor", has completed an FAA and DOTD approved Master Plan, Action Plan, and/or Airport Layout Plan which outlines the specific future development of the LeGros Memorial Airport; and, the Sponsor is desirous of implementing a portion of the approved Plan recommendations which provide for the critically needed improvements as stated below to substantially improve the safety and usability of the Airport, but does not have sufficient funds of its own required for completing the needed improvements; and,

WHEREAS, the LA DOTD, Division of Aviation is authorized by Title 2 to expend funds for the construction or enlargements of airports for the safety and advancement of aeronautics;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

SECTION I

That the Sponsor does hereby formally request that the LA DOTD, Division of Aviation provided funds required to complete the airport improvements at the LeGros Memorial Airport specifically described as:

- 1. Rehabilitate Airfield Drainage; \$450,000.00
- 2. LPV Obstruction Survey; \$65,000.00
- 3. Aviation Fuel System; \$130,000.00
- 4. Security Fencing and Gates; \$160,000.00
- 5. Terminal Apron Overlay; \$190,000.00
- 6. New Airfield Pavement Markings; \$55,000.00
- 7. Taxilane and Apron for T-hangar Development; \$475,000.00
- 8. Parallel Taxiway (Runway4-22); \$1,950,000.00

SECTION II

The Sponsor does hereby appoint and authorize the LA DOTD, Division of Aviation to act as agent for the Sponsor for the following purposes:

To provide financial assistance to the Sponsor in the amount id ten percent (10%) of the total cost necessary for the completion of the described improvement to match other funds to be provided by the Federal Aviation Administration which may amount to ninety percent (90%) of the total project costs.

SECTION III

That the said LA DOTD, Division of Aviation be and is hereby assured that all necessary servitudes, rights-of-way, rights of ingress and egress and means thereof will be furnished by the Sponsor and the titles thereto will be valid and indefeasible, and that the Sponsor will assume ownership, financial reporting, and complete responsibility for the maintenance and upkeep of the airport after completion of said improvement.

SECTION IV

That the Sponsor will save and hold the said LA DOTD, Division of Aviation, its officers, agents, and employees harmless from any liability or claim for damages arising out of the project, including death or injuries to third parties including, but not limited to, liability or claim for damages out of the negligence of said LA DOTD, Division of Aviation, its officers, agents, or employees, and expressly agrees to defend any suit of any nature brought against the LA DOTD, Division of Aviation as a result of this project.

SECTION V

That the President of the Sponsor be and is hereby authorized and directed to evidence this agreement by affixing his signature at the place provided thereof on this resolution and on subsequent related documents/agreements as required by the rules and regulations of the Federal Aviation Administration and the State of Louisiana and the Clerk is hereby authorized to attest said execution.

SECTION VI

That this resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption.
