ORDINANCE #975

AN ORDINANCE MAKING IT UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON TO OPERATE OR DRIVE A MOTOR VEHICLE UPON CLODAY MENARD ROAD IN ACADIA PARISH, LOUISIANA, AT A SPEED IN EXCESS OF **TWENTY-FIVE MILES PER HOUR**, AND, PROVIDING FOR THE PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED by the Police Jury of Acadia Parish, Louisiana, that it shall be unlawful for any person to operate or drive a motor vehicle in excess of **twenty-five miles per hour** on the following described Parish Road:

Cloday Menard Road

ORDINANCE #976

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE #923.
ORDINANCE #923 IS HEREBY AMENDED TO ADOPT CERTAIN SECTIONS
OF THE INTERNATIONAL BUILDING CODE AND
INTERNATIONAL RESIDENTIAL CODE.

THE FIRST ORDINANCE NO. 923 is hereby amended to read as follows:

AN AMENDMENT TO ACADIA PARISH BUILDING CODE ORDINANCE 923,
SECTION 5-102.

Section 5-102. Adoption of State Uniform Construction Code.

Pursuant to La. R.S. 40:1730.21 et seq., the following codes are hereby adopted as the regulations governing the construction of buildings and other structures in Acadia Parish. Unless specified, all standards contained in a reference code or adopted and included for purposes of this article. Unless referenced by name or letter designation, no appendix or appendices to a code is adopted.

- (1) The International Building Code, 2006 Edition, as published by the International Code Council, including the following sections of Chapter 1 ADMINISTRATION are adopted:

Sections: 104.1 General; 104.8 Liability; 104.10 Modifications; 104.11 Alternative Materials, Design and Methods of Construction and Equipment; 105.2.3. Public Service Agencies; 105.3 Application for Permit; 105.5 Expiration; 105.7 Placement of Permits; 107.3 Temporary Power; 108.1 Payment of Fees; 108.2 Schedule of Permit Fees; 108.6 Refunds; 109.1 General; 109.3. Required Inspections; 109.3.1; 109.3.2; 109.3.3; 109.3.4; 109.3.5; 109.3.6; 109.3.7; 109.3.8; 109.3.10; 109.4; Inspection Agencies; 111.1 Connection of Service Utilities; 111.2 Temporary Connections; 111.3 Authority to Disconnect Service Utilities;

- (2) International Existing Building Code, 2006 Edition, as published by the International Code Council, including any standards referenced therein, but

not including any appendices thereto and not including Chapter 1 ADMINISTRATION;

- (3) International Residential Code, 2006 Edition, as published by the International Code Council, including Appendix J, Existing Buildings and Structures, and including Part 1 - Administrative, as identified below:

Sections: R104.1. General; R104.8. Liability; R104.10. Modifications; R104.11. Alternative Materials, Design and Methods of Construction and Equipment; R105.3. Application for Permit; R105.5. Expiration; R105.7. Placement of Permits; R105.8. Responsibility (IRC only); R107.3. Temporary Power; R108.1 Payment of Fees; R108.2. Schedule of Permit Fees; R108.6. Refunds; R109.1 Types of Inspections; R109.1.1; R109.1.2; R109.1.3; R109.1.4; R109.1.5; R109.2; Inspection Agencies; & R111.1 Connection of Service Utilities; R111.2 Temporary Connections; R111.3 Authority to Disconnect Service Utilities;

But not including Parts V - Mechanical, VII - Plumbing and VIII - Electrical IRCR 301.2.1.1 (design criteria therein shall be amended as follows and shall only apply to the International Residential Code, 2006 edition):

- a. Item 6, Guide to Concrete Masonry Residential Construction in High Wind Areas, as published by the American Concrete Institute, shall be added;
 - b. Item 7, Optional Code plus Fortified for Safer Living, as published by Institute for Business and Home Safety, shall be added; and
 - c. Item 8, Optional Code plus Blueprint for Safety, as published by Federal Alliance for Safe Homes, shall be added;
- (4) International Mechanical Code, 2006 Edition, as published by the International Code Council;
- (5) Louisiana State Plumbing Code (Part IX. Plumbing of the State's Sanitary Code);
- (6) International Fuel Gas Code, 2006 Edition, as published by the International Code Council; and
- (7) National Electrical Code, 2005 Edition, as published by the National Fire Protection Association.
